SCHOOL CODE OF CONDUCT

PURPOSE OF THE CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Conduct is designed to communicate what Milnerton High School stands for in terms of its values and principles, what behaviours we encourage, what behaviours we discourage. It includes the measures we use to discourage behaviours we deem to be undesirable.

PRINCIPLES GOVERNING THE CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. Rules and sanctions are intended to be corrective; they must lead to an improvement in behaviour.
- 2. Rules and sanctions must be simple and clear.
- 3. Rules must be enforceable.
- 4. Rules and procedures must be applied consistently and timeously.
- 5. Rules and procedures must be perceived to be fair.
- 6. Rules and sanctions must be understood by staff, learners and parents.
- 7. The reasons for the rules must be clearly communicated.

SCOPE

The scope of the Code of Conduct includes the physical premises, proximity to, in transit to and from school; representation of the school either by being dressed in official school or sports uniform, or by means of participation in school related activities, whether in uniform or not (i.e. tours, events etc.), or any other situation where the learner is recognisable as a Milnerton High learner, or when the connection to Milnerton High is clear

LEVEL 3

UNDESIRABLE CONDUCT

- Repeated Level 2 infringements.
- Under the influence of /smelling of/ in possession of /usage of alcohol/ drugs / mind altering substances at school and/or approved school activities, e.g. tours
- Possession and/or distribution of pornographic, racist, sexist material, or viewing of and/or downloading of such on any computer or cell phone
- > Theft /Accepting/Buying stolen items
- Arson
- > Serious vandalism
- Harassment /Sexual Harassment (Harassment is seen as the persistently acting in a way that distresses and annoys another person
- Gang-related activities
- Making bomb threats
- Failing to attend Community Service/Principal's DT
- Dangerous weapons: bringing weapons onto school grounds, threatening/assault with a weapon / assault with a weaponised object.
- Positive for an illegal substance
- Possession/Dealing in drugs or any mind/behaviour altering substances on or off the school premises
- Learner is found guilty of crime in court
- Any Bullying, including Cyber Bullying

SANCTIONS

The severity of the offence will bear the appropriate level of sanction which may include but is not limited to, the following, or a combination of them:

- > Community Service
- Suspension
- Parent discussion/involvement
- Expulsion
- Police involvement
- > Compensation.
- Double previous punishment
- Final written warning/contract
- Immediate removal from the school premises
- Handed over to the Police immediately
- Governing Body hearing that can lead to suspension and/or recommendation for expulsion
- Suspension until the learner can prove that he/she is clean, furnishes proof of registration at institution for rehabilitation.
- Removal of all privileges/defined privileges
- Removal from class by Code of Conduct
- > Special programme on topic
- > Expulsion from school
- > Restorative practice

- > Truancy. (Being absent from school without parental consent)
- Engaging in/or inciting Racist, sexist, biased and discriminatory comments and behaviour/defamation of character/hate speech
- Engaged and Inciting Violence/Fighting/Assault
- Supporting and/or organising any form of illegal activities
- Disrespectful behaviour/language directed towards educators/persons in authority
- > Repeated fraudulent offences
- Damaging the image of Milnerton High School
- Indecent behaviour, including acts of a sexual nature or any other behaviour that can be deemed as indecent by a reasonable person.
- Breaking and entering/gaining access to private or school property without prior consent.
